Introduction

The Imagineer Systems License Manager for mocha allows you to run floating licences for mocha across a network.

Features in License Manager 1.2.5

This release adds support for activating mocha Pro CN licenses

New features include:

- Support for mocha Pro CN

Known Issues

Issue:	DE2622: The Unix License Manager leaves the previous license service running
Platform:	OS X and Linux
Bug Description:	When upgrading the License Manager, the service for the previous version of the License Manager is not uninstalled and continues running.
Workaround:	Stop the License Manager service before installing the License Manager. After upgrading, re-start the License Manager service.
Issue:	DE1759 There is no message about the inability to start the server without elevated privileges on RHEL
Platform:	Linux
Bug Description:	The previous server status will show in Server tab but there are no messages in the description field if the user is not running with elevated privileges.

Installation

The License Manager is installed via the installer package. Run the installer and follow the prompts.

Windows

1. Once the installation file, LicenseManager-1.2.5-xxxx.exe, has been downloaded onto the system, double click the file to begin installation

2. Follow the instructions on screen.

Mac OS X

1. Once the installation file, LicenseManager-1.2.5-xxxx.dmg, has been downloaded onto the system, double click the DMG file and this will open a new window
2. Double click the LicenseManager-1.2.5.mpkg file inside the DMG to begin installation
3. Follow the instructions on screen.

Linux

1. Once the installation file, LicenseManager-1.2.5-xxxx.i386.rpm (or LicenseManager-1.2.5-xxxx.x86_64.rpm for 64-bit), has been downloaded, change into the directory you saved it into. Note that the 'x' in the file name is substituted by the current release number.
2. Become root using the command `su` or `login as root`
3. Install the package with the command: `rpm -Uvh LicenseManager-1.2.5-xxxx.rpm`
4. rpm may prompt you to install additional dependencies. If these are required, download and install them using the appropriate method for your distribution, for example 'yum' or 'up2date'.

Licensing

The License Manager requires no licence itself to run, but the License Manager is required for installing floating licences.
